
A "naka-naka" heritage site refers to a community asset as following: •with certain idiosyncratic features found nowhere else, but which would not achieve recognition as an important cultural property of the nation or a World Heritage site due to the fact a person will let out a small chuckle when they first see.

•upon more serious reflection, because they can see that it links the site's locality with cultural currents in the broader world along with people, communities and objects and artifacts, and that it generates a variety of benefits for people.

·causes that a person upon seeing it to utter the Japanese expression "naka-naka~! (pretty good)". A "naka-naka" heritage site spontaneously evokes a desire in people to save not just the built structure itself for future generations, but all those connections that it embodies in their undiminished


2. Categories of "Naka-naka" Heritage
