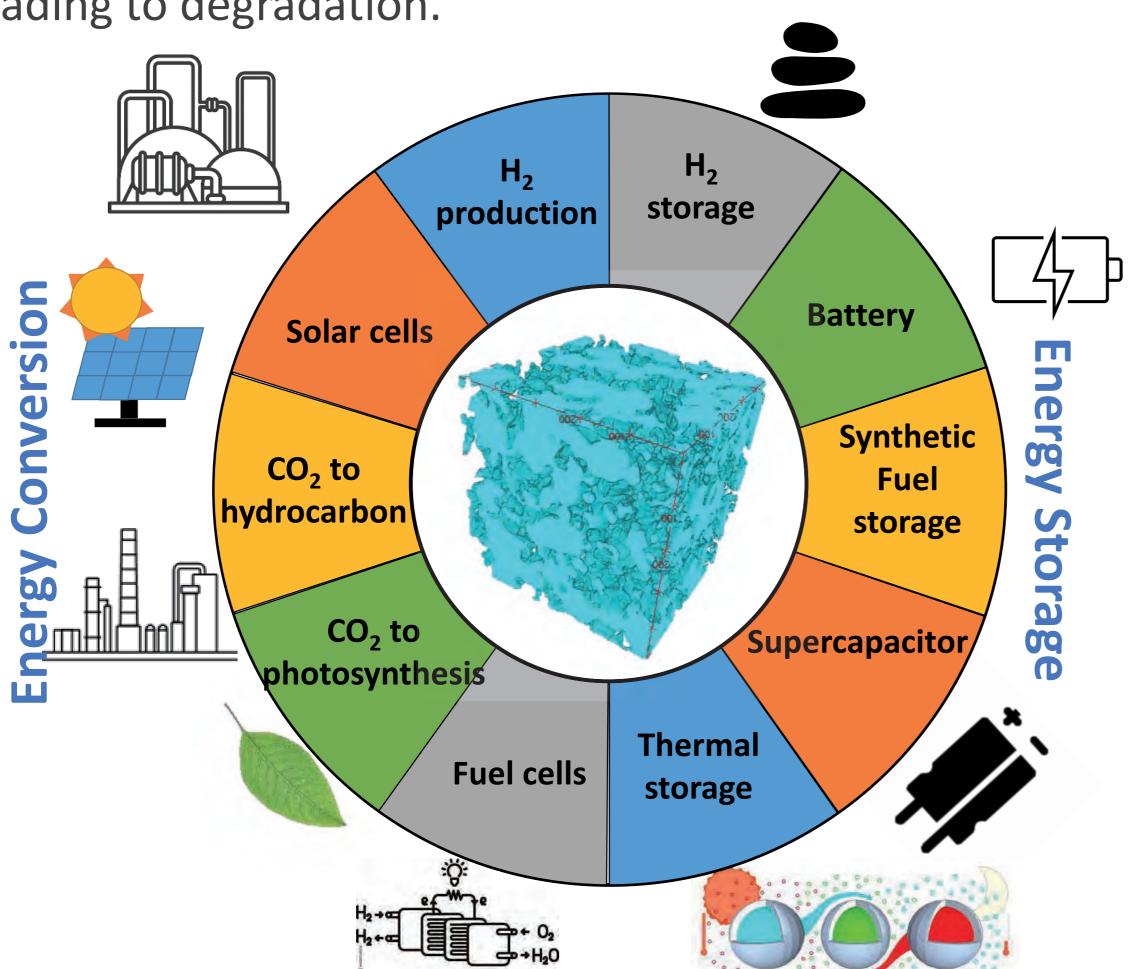

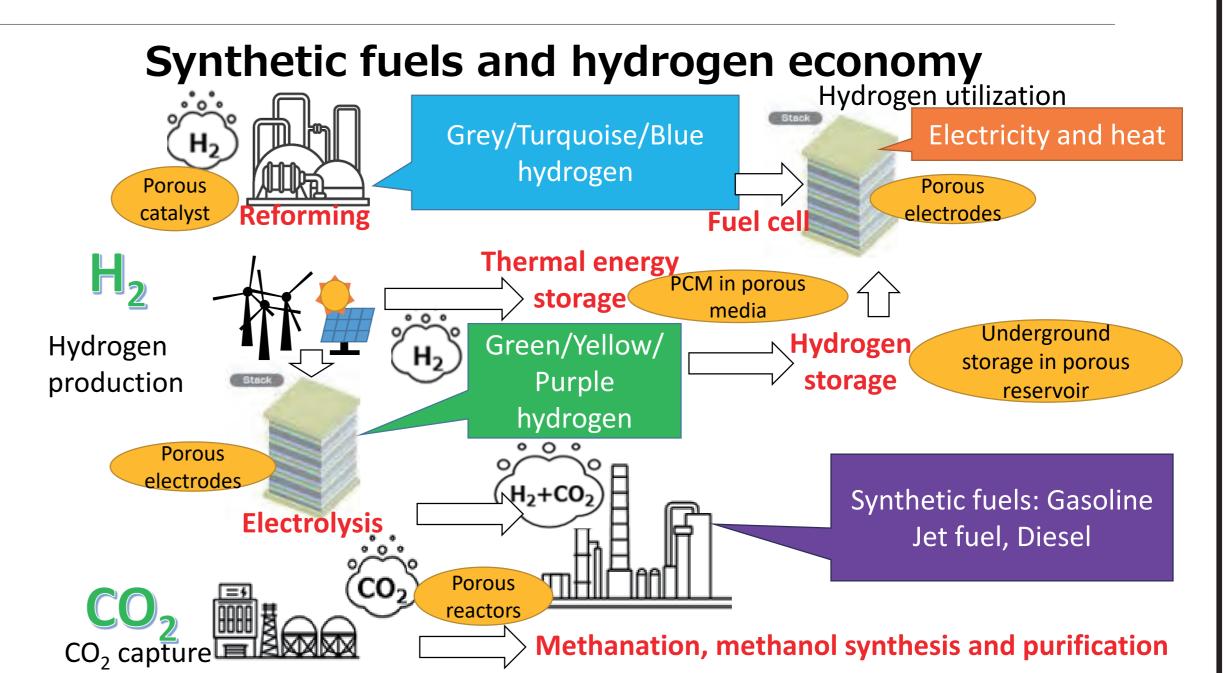

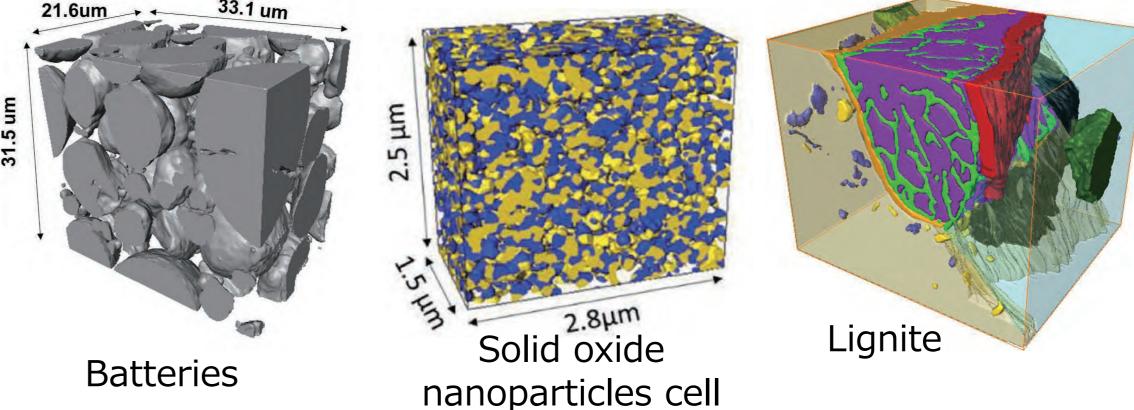
Porous materials in fuel processing and energy technologies

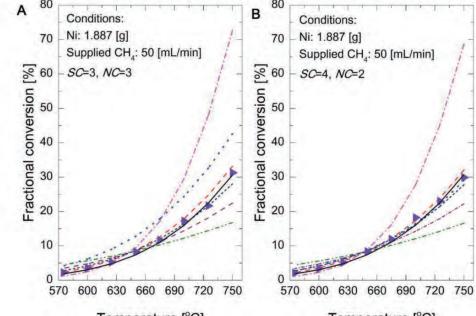


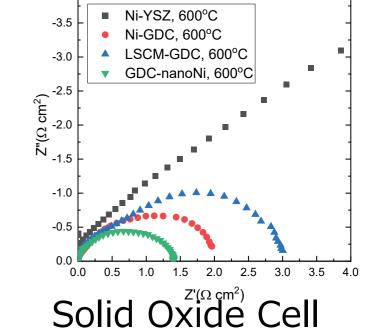


3D porous multiphase microstructure fabrication and characterization methods
