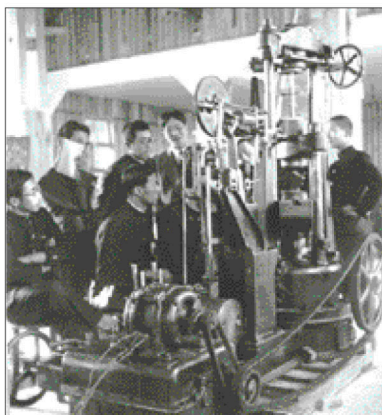

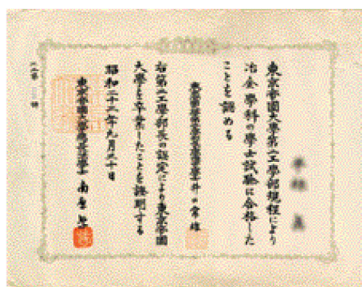

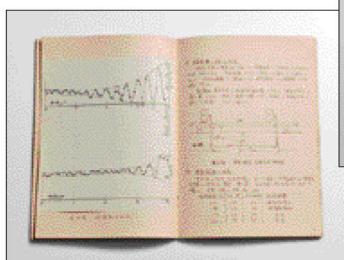
Campus Building of the Second Faculty of Engineering



Experiment on material mechanics



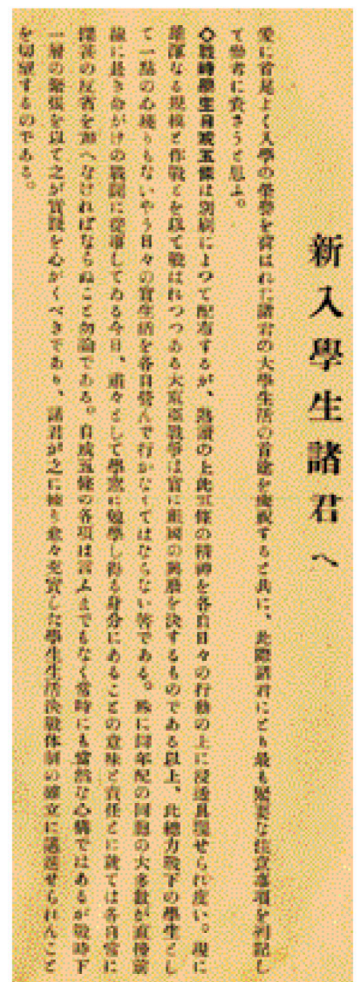

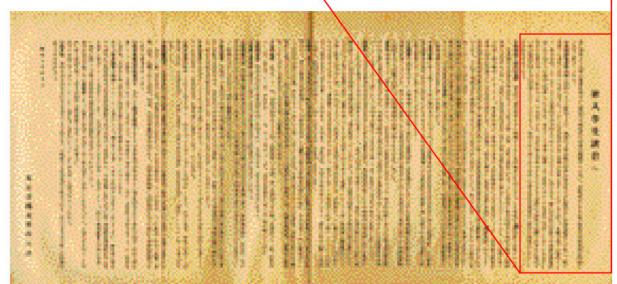
